In the Studio

his past summer,
Christian Edition began
working on its newest album, *Jesus Paid It All*, the
12th album recorded by the men's
chorus. Our work at Martinsound
Studios began on the first Sunday
in August and continued several
Sundays into October. Each recording session commenced with
prayer, as we made sure our
focus was clear before facing

the microphones.

After all these years with CE, I still find the recording process to be a fascinating experience. In the studio there are several microphones placed intentionally and deliberately in certain locations, and the singers are located around the mics in a specific order with each section (first tenor, second tenor, baritone and bass) having its own microphone. We do not stand in formation like we would for a concert. thus allowing our engineer and director to adjust each section in a song according to the balancing needs. After recording an entire song, one section at a time, the singers are able to sit back and listen to a rough cut of the entire rendition through impressive stereo speakers in the studio. Each musical piece, typically three to four minutes in length, can take from one to three hours to record.

After all of the recording is finished, director Calvin Knipschild sits with Dan Blessinger, our engineer. Together, they go through each musical cut and begin the process of perfecting an enjoyable sound of high quality for the



listeners and, more importantly, to point them to Jesus and His great love for each of us through music.

The recording sessions can be long and exhausting, but the spirit of each man never fades, and each gathering is filled with plenty of laughs. Upon graduation from Glendale Union Academy, she continued her education and obtained her Licensed Vocational Nurse certificate and worked for three years in the Emergency Room at Burbank Memorial Hospital. However, her real passion and the bulk of her nursing career were spent in the motion picture industry. This is where she excelled! Susan loved her responsibilities as the baby nurse and the resident animal expert on *The* Tonight Show with Jay Leno and other variety shows. She taught snake handling at the Los Angeles Zoo, so she was the one called on in case there was an emergency. She was also employed on the movie set of Beethoven where she cared for and handled the canines and ultimately adopted one of the stars, a Cocker Spaniel named Chelsea.

Susan loved music and Christian Edition was one of her favorite musical groups. She credited her re-conversion to a Christian Edition concert she attended several vears ago which ultimately led her back to God. She and Calvin had attended GUA together so when

Susie saw that Christian Edition was singing at a church nearby, she made it a point to attend and renew the acquaintance. Her heart was touched with the messages in song and word and she determined to return to church attendance. She took Bible studies, gave up smoking and was baptized. Susie became a very active member of the Eagle Rock SDA Church, eventually assuming the office of Outreach Ministry Coordinator. She was the



motivational sparkplug behind the Celebrate Recovery and Breath-Free stop smoking programs because she felt a burden to minister to others with addiction issues. Susie also wanted to get involved with Christian Edition's ministry, so when the opportunity arose, she was elected to serve as the Secretary on the Board of Directors, a position she held for the past three and a half years.

Additionally, Susan served many years as the President of the Glendale Adventist Academy Alumni Association where she planned many Alumni Weekend events. Her circle of service also embraced Secretary of Motion Picture Local 767 and involvement in the Burbank Tournament of Roses committee for 12 years.

Susie also loved horses. She helped train them and taught young riders the skills of the equestrian arts. For many years she traveled with her mom, attending horse shows and competitive events.

Susie was always comforting others and was there for anyone who needed an open, non-judgmental ear to listen and offer wisdom. When her brother-in-law's shop burned to the ground, Susie gave comfort and support all night to her family. When her sister, Marti, was in the hospital for a month, unconscious, Susie was by her side every day. She was Marti's advocate for health care and assisted her through the crisis. The accounts of her dedication to family and friends are numerous.

Susan was loyal, organized, loving, happy, unselfish, beautifully soulful and an asset to all whose lives she nurtured and touched. She was loved by all and her memory will not fade with time.

Although Susan's earthly journey ended on January 9, 2009, and she now rests in peace, let each of us determine to see her again "Soon and Very Soon" where there will be no more sickness, pain or parting by death, because all the causes of tears will be wiped away.
