None of our rehearsing had prepared us for this experience.

The song went very well, and an extremely enthusiastic crowd roared their approval as the song ended. Sandi left the stage but not the sanctuary as CE sang for the next 40 minutes. Once we finished, we took our seats and Sandi sang for the next 50 minutes. Our program ended by Sandi and CE singing together the great old Christian hymn "How Great Thou Art." What an amazing experience that was, every bit as wonderful as the opening song. The crowd asked Sandi to come back out for an encore and she obliged, singing two songs. The second song, the old Louie Armstrong classic, "What a Wonderful World," was a surprise, but the lyrics were changed to make it an homage to God's creation. We hadn't prepared to sing anything else with her, but on a whim Sandi pointed to us on the chorus and invited us to sing with her. She did it again after the second verse, and again after the third, but with a twist. She asked us to add harmony, something we all love to do. It came out perfectly, and a lasting image for many of us will be seeing Sandi throw her head back, close her eyes, and relish the moment with us. As far as spontaneity goes, this was as good as it gets.

Sandi was gracious enough to stay afterwards and sign autographs and take pictures with everyone who wished to do so. It was a wonderful way to end the night and to see what a genuine person she is. While the power of God worked through her that night, and we were fed, we also got to see her as a real

person, and we greatly enjoyed that about her.

The whole evening, while fun beyond belief, was also a tremendous spiritual blessing. CE was greatly impressed with how spiritual the entire worship program was that night. Sandi showed us a very human side to a very public person. She loves the Lord, and it comes through loud and clear in her music and comments.

CE has been privileged and blessed with many amazing opportunities. This one was definitely at the top of the list. We don't know if we'll get to do this again, but for one night at least it was an amazing night of praise with an outstanding musician who has committed her life to singing for our Savior.

Traveling with CE took Joyce and Richard to concerts in California, Alaska, Arizona, Florida, Kentucky, Michigan, Missouri, Ohio and Washington. All the while, Joyce was taking pictures, writing, and encouraging the singers and their family members to write articles. She worked closely with the late Sonny Ines, who, in addition to singing bass, was CE's graphic artist and layout designer for many years.

This was a happy and rewarding collaboration for both Joyce and Richard.

Joyce's last trip with CE was in March to San Diego for concerts at Bonita Valley, Paradise Valley and Escondido.

Upon her return home on March 3, she was admitted to the

hospital with a diagnosis of pancreatic cancer which, seven weeks later, took her life. Her tireless efforts, laughter and enthusiasm are greatly missed by all who knew her, especially the CE family.

Joyce loved everything about Christian Edition and was interested and involved in their ministry until the end. In planning her memorial service with Richard, she specified not only that she wanted CE to sing, but which songs, including one of their newest, "Jerusalem." Her wishes were granted and Richard stated that, "There's no way anyone can hear 'Jerusalem' and not want to be there!" We all look forward to again laughing with Joyce and praising God in "the city John saw."

So hold them dear TODAY! Take time to say,


