Sharing 40 Years of Memories, Part 2

In our last newsletter, Christian Edition members shared their favorite memories over the years. This compilation is the second of this two-part series.

David Mitchell - Baritone (joined 2019)

I was practicing our music in preparation for Calimesa Camp Meeting and recalled the first time I heard the song, "There Is A Way," during CE rehearsal back when I first began with the group in 2019. It had a profound effect on me for a couple of reasons. First, the reaction I saw from Calvin was emotionally overwhelming, so much so that it made it hard to continue singing while tearing up (we both were!). It was at that moment I knew God had opened the door for me to sing with CE. The way I learned music was that it had to have your heart behind the words and melodious sounds to really bring the intended blessing to those listening. The message in this particular song is so timely and hope-filled, that when you listen, your heart cannot help but grow full in recognizing that JESUS is the "Way" that is being sung about. When you see me fighting back the emotion when we sing it next, you'll know the story behind why it is so touching for me!

Bruce Powers - Baritone (joined 1981 and 2009)

Finding just one memorable moment is tough because there are so many. There was our first performance at Eagle Rock SDA Church for Pastor Jim Brown in 1981-then known as the Eagle Rock Men's Chorus; the Christmas performance at the Dorothy Chandler Music Pavilion; the Friday night rehearsal at Glendale Academy where we came up with the name Christian Edition; rejoining Christian Edition in 2009; Mt. Hermon weekends; the Alaska Cruise 2011; Swannanoa Women's Prison, North Carolina, and the whole interaction with the women there, particularly when they symbolically broke their chains during the song "Amazing Grace, My Chains are Gone," and the guards not letting us out until we sang for them; then finally,

the Markham Woods SDA Church when a little girl gave Calvin a big hug after the children's story. Take your pick!

Chris Sheridan - Baritone (joined 2015)

Being asked to pick one Christian Edition moment that was most memorable is almost impossible since there have been so many for me: Men's Chorus Festivals; Caribbean Cruise; Maranatha Events broadcast to millions around the world; the performances at the Fox Theaters in Riverside and Hanford; and singing "Jerusalem" with the Hoppers. How do I narrow it down?

Then, it hit me. May 19, 2018. CE sang at St. Peter and St. Paul Catholic Church in Alta Loma, California. Throughout the decades, the group has sung in Christian churches of all denominations, large and small, across the country. Singing at this particular church, however, held special meaning for my wife, Diane, and me as this church was our home parish for nearly 12 years when we lived in Alta Loma.

While planning our service with St. Peter and Paul's Music Director, Audrey Donaldson, it was agreed CE would sing five songs during the 4:00 PM mass that Saturday afternoon and then provide a full 90-minute concert following the mass. At the end of the mass following the pastor's dismissal of the congregation, CE sang one last song—I don't even remember what it was—but at the conclusion, the packed church gave us a large ovation with Audrey announcing, "Well, Christian Edition just took us to church!" About 75% of the congregation, around 400 people, stuck around for the full concert and similarly, enthusiastically responded to our songs as we shared God's love through song.

Following the program-ending "Jerusalem," the crowd rose to its feet in thunderous, sustained applause as the group exited the worship space down the center aisle. The appreciative congregation had obviously been touched, as an unplanned encore brought the group back into the church for one last song and another standing ovation. The Holy Spirit works wonders and moves people deeply

when they open their hearts to the Word. Add in the Christian Edition sound to the Word and the message is clear: there is Hope and Peace through Jesus Christ!

Keith Smith - Baritone (joined 2008)

The first most memorable moment for me was the first time I officially joined CE. My first time singing was at Mount Hermon Christian Conference Center (CCC). The audience there was so appreciative and related so very well to CE. Many of the guests knew right away that I was the newest member of the group. They made me feel so special, like a rock star, or so it seemed to me. Combine that feeling along with the beautiful setting of nature in the Santa Cruz mountains that epitomizes Mt. Hermon, and this is a memory that I will always cherish.

I will refrain from much detail about other memorable moments but suffice it to say I had to contain my emotions when, as part of the pastoral team of CE, I had to give my first talk and I knew there was a DIVINE presence that I felt strongly, or the time I had to give the talk on the date of my father's birthday after he had recently passed away.

Craig Vendouris - Baritone (joined 1984 and 2002)

Asking me to pick my favorite CE memory is akin to asking a parent which child is their favorite. The first time we sang at General Conference in New Orleans; singing backup for Andy Williams at two of his Christmas concerts in Los Angeles; the first time a new song came together; my first Family Reunion concert in Orlando, 2003, and talking at length with Bob Edwards, one of my musical idols; all the road trips with Calvin, Sonny, and Chris; the intimate moments with worshipers after the Spirit really moved on their hearts; the Caribbean cruise and listening to Karl Haffner talk each day, and then spending time with him one-on-one; the fun and fellowship of so many rehearsals—all of these matter in big ways to me.

The moment I'll remember most is the first Sandi Patty concert. For us to find out she was even remotely interested in singing with us was mind-boggling, to say the least! It was like the Green Bay Packers asking me to join them for a few plays on Sunday. We met up with her at La Sierra University Church in the fellowship hall where we warmed up. She was warm and intimate, not cold, or too important to be bothered with us. She joined us for our pre-concert prayer and we all headed to the church.

Sandi did her songs and then invited us up. We had worked hard on "Opening Praise Medley" and "How Great Thou Art" so that she wouldn't think we were a bunch of hacks, and it went even better than we had hoped. At the end of the program, she kept us up there with her for her encore, something we had NOT planned on. She invited us to sing a song none of us had practiced and probably not all of us knew, "What a Wonderful World" by Louis Armstrong, but we joined in and harmonized as best we could. It went better than well. She was available for pictures and autographs afterward and was just as warm and genuine as you would hope her to be. It all went so well that we were able to perform with her a second time a few years later. They were both amazing experiences, and I'm so glad I got to be part of them.

Gary Gifford - Bass (joined 2011)

Early in my Christian Edition experience, we were all riding a bus from California to sing for congregations in Arizona. The trip promised to be quite lengthy, so I thought I would put the time to good use by quietly reading my music and listening to an audio recordingusing earplugs so as not to distract other CE members as we traveled. I was strengthening my memory of the songs, and it was working; however, evidently as I rode along, the activity of thinking about the music and words was modified to humming and those around me began to hear the humming. Because the humming was so helpful in memorizing the tune, I guess I thought I should practice the words, too. So I began quietly singing the words out loud. I was doing just fine, and the music was sticking in my head, but then I heard a voice from the back of the bus. It said, "Gifford, save the concert!" So I did. Since then, humor always surfaces when someone says, "Remember the bus concert?"

Walter Nelson - Bass (joined 2017)

I will never forget the powerful message that Calvin gave to all the Men's Choral Groups gathered for the Loma Linda Men's Chorus Festival in February, 2018. It was at the Friday night rehearsal, and we were all gathered in the assembly hall of the Loma Linda Academy and Calvin reminded us that we were not performers but ministers sharing messages of hope and encouragement to a world in need. He was truly inspired as he spoke to us that night and I'll never forget the powerful effect it had on me.

The second most unforgettable moment for me, of course, was when he placed me literally front and center on the first day I was to officially sing with the group. We had two major concerts that day and I was trying desperately to keep 30 songs, their words, and their parts in my head and had no one to hide behind on this, my official CE debut. The good news was that I somehow made it through the day. We were even asked to do an encore at the end of our first concert in a large Catholic Church. The bad news was that the song they chose for the encore was one I had never even looked at, yet there I was front and center thinking "fake it 'til you make it." God got me through!

Highlights of my many CE memories include the anniversary trips to Alaska in 2006 and 2011, and then to the Caribbean in 2016. A Lesson in Christian Edition History, Part 2

In Part 1 of the brief history of Christian Edition, there wasn't room to fit everything in but there is one event that I would like to include here at the beginning of Part 2. In the very early years of CE, we learned a lot of songs and really wanted to make an album of some of our favorites that we could share with our audience to increase our outreach ministry.

We prayed a lot about it and asked God to provide the funds needed for such an endeavor. By 1985, we had established our prayer ministry and at a concert at Paradise Valley SDA Church in National City, CA, Dave Logé, CE's Business Manager at the time, gave the prayer appeal and mentioned that we didn't have the funds for an album yet but that we believed God would provide the funds in His time.


The following day CE was scheduled to sing for the early morning worship service at the West Coast Regional Convention of the A.L. Williams Company (now known as Primerica, Inc.) at the Hotel del Coronado in San Diego, CA. About halfway through our last song, a gentleman jumped up on stage, grabbed the mic, and said, "Folks, aren't these guys terrific? Join me in giving them a warm welcome. It's my understanding that they don't yet have a recorded album, so I want to make a personal pledge right now-and you can join me if you like, they're a non-profit organization. I will personally contribute \$5,000 (the microphone cut out momentarily) to them for their first album." Turning away from the mic to leave the stage, the gentleman became aware of the technical glitch and returned to the mic, saying "You may have misunderstood, I am personally pledging \$25,000, not \$5,000 for their first album!" We were amazed and speechless, but we were ever so grateful and this contribution provided the funds to produce our first album, Fishers of Men.

The man who contributed the \$25,000 was

Beau Adams, then CFO of the A.L. Williams Company. Mr. Adams had stayed in his room that morning but was summoned by his wife to come down to the convention room to hear "this marvelous men's group perform their gospel music." God truly works in wonderful and mysterious ways.


In 2002 Christian Edition was commissioned by the Adventist Heritage Ministry to produce an album of songs dating from the beginnings of the Seventh-day Adventist church in the

1840s and 50s. The result was CE's ninth album, Songs of the Advent Pioneers, released in cassette and CD formats. Even before the album was released, CE was invited to sing for the Adventist Heritage Ministry convention at



the Westin South Coast Plaza in Costa Mesa, CA, to promote the soon-to-be released album. CE was also invited to sing for the CASA (Christian Association of Senior Adults) Convention at the Pomona First Baptist Church in February.

Also in 2002, Christian Edition released their second video, *The 20-Year Reunion Concert*,



which was a live recording of their 20th Anniversary concert held at the Loma Linda University SDA Church in November of 2001. It was released in both VHS and DVD formats. Christian Edition also participated in another Family Reunion videotaping at the Adventist Media

Center located in Simi Valley, CA, honoring 55 years of music ministry by Del Delker, contralto and soloist for the Voice of Prophecy radio broadcast ministry.

For spring break 2002, CE again toured Florida, traveling to Avon Park, Miami, Naples, Ft. Myers, and Forest Lake and again to the Pacific Northwest in April where they sang at Meadow Glade, Portland, Gladstone Senior Living Center, and Springfield. CE also toured Northern California, Michigan, and Colorado where they sang for Focus on the Family, several churches in the Denver metro area, and the Colorado Springs Church of the Nazarene.

The year 2002 was rounded out with CE singing for the Voice of Prophecy Camp Meeting at the Adventist Media Center in Simi Valley, CA, the Orangewood Adventist Academy Alumni Homecoming in Garden Grove, CA, the Rotary Club International Convention at the Sheraton Universal Hotel in Universal City, CA, the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart Convent in Los Angeles, CA, as well as at various local churches.

2003 found Christian Edition on tour in Northern California where they sang in St. Helena, Santa Rosa, Ukiah, and Redwood Valley. They also sang at various churches in Southern California including Eagle Rock, Yucaipa, Palm Springs, Thousand Oaks, Camarillo, Whittier, Westminster, and Redlands. They also participated in another Voice of Prophecy Family Reunion video-taping session held in Orlando, FL, where two more videos were recorded.

2003 was a busy touring year and in addition to the tours already mentioned, CE toured Central California where they sang at Monterey Bay Academy, San Francisco, San Jose, and Santa Cruz. Then in April, they toured Kentucky and Ohio where they sang in Louisville, KY, Covington, OH, and Lexington, KY, at the SDA Church as well as at the Gardenside Baptist Church. This was the beginning of a close friendship between CE and David Dale, the Minister of Music at the Gardenside Baptist Church.

CE sang for the 2003 Glendale Adventist Academy Homecoming Vespers service at the Glendale City SDA Church and for the CASA Convention in Glendora, CA. They also sang in a patriotic program called *Let Freedom Ring* put together by Tom Neslund at the Garden Grove SDA Church. In August they hosted David Dale and the Voice of Praise Choir from the Gardenside Baptist Church who were on tour in Southern California. They also gave a concert at the Loma Linda University SDA Church for their Camp Meeting Concert Series that year.

2004 began with a tour through Central Florida where they sang in Ocala, Winter Springs, Forest Lake, and Zephyrhills. Then, for spring break, they again toured Ohio, Tennessee, and Kentucky where they sang

at several SDA,
Baptist, and United
Methodist churches.
They also recorded
and released a tenth
album, *Midnight Cry*,
again in both cassette
and CD formats. This
album was dedicated
to Michael and Lori
Spencer's teenage



son, Justin, who died while on a mission trip to Peru while CE was on tour in Kentucky.

When news of Justin's death reached CE in Kentucky, Michael and Lori had to immediately return home to handle the necessary funeral arrangements, which left the rest of the tour hanging without an accompanist. There were still five concerts to go so they had to make a decision whether or not to cancel the rest of the tour. Fortunately, David Dale, the Minister of Music at the Gardenside Baptist Church, was an excellent pianist and willingly stepped in to accompany the group for the remaining concerts, the last of which was at his own church on Sunday morning. There were several songs, however, that could not be performed because there was no printed accompaniment for them. Michael had arranged them and only had the accompaniment in his head.

This was a devastating event, not only for Michael and Lori, but for all of Christian Edition as well because Justin had practically grown up with CE and was dearly loved by all. It didn't take much arm-twisting to get the guys to sing for Justin's memorial service at Pleasant Hill Academy in Northern California where Michael was teaching music at the time. For this trip, Sam Valenzuela (a CE first tenor) borrowed a bus

from his church and drove the group to Pleasant Hill. The bus could barely make it up the hills and the guys joked that they could walk faster than it was going. But, the Lord blessed and everyone arrived safely.

2004 continued with concerts in Southern California as well as tours to Northern and Central California where they sang for churches of various denominations. It was also the first year of many to follow where CE was invited to sing at the Mt. Hermon Christian Conference Center in Santa Cruz, CA, for their Summer Concert Series. The setting of this conference center is in a beautiful, peaceful redwood forest, so CE was always glad to accept the invitation. They also performed a benefit concert for a dear friend of Christian Edition, Buzz Starrett, whose wife had had a very serious fall from a horse, gave a concert at the La Sierra University SDA Church, and were invited to sing for the Big Bear Camp Meeting in Big Bear, CA, that summer.

2005 began with a bus tour to Arizona where CE sang at Paradise Valley, Phoenix, Tempe, and Sun City at the Stardust Bible Church. Of course, CE also had to stop at the Organ Stop Pizza Parlor in Mesa. There was also another Central California tour with stops at Modesto, Rocklin, Placerville and Lodi at the Zion Reform Church. CE was again asked to sing for the CASA Convention, this time at the Saddleback Church in Forest Lake, CA. Other tours took them to San Diego and Thousand Oaks where they sang at SDA churches as well as at the Monte Vista Presbyterian Church, and in Fullerton at the First Evangelical Free Church.

The main event of 2005 was singing for the General Conference Session of Seventh-day Adventists held in St. Louis, MO. Christian Edition performed on the main stage, the Chapel Records stage, the World Missions stage, and in a smaller hall where they gave a full concert. CE also manned a booth in the Exhibition Hall to promote sales of their albums and an Alaska Cruise scheduled for the following year. As it was the 4th of July weekend, CE enjoyed the fireworks display at the St. Louis Arch and some even took time to travel up inside the Arch to experience the view from that lofty height.

After returning from the General Conference Session, CE went on another Central California tour where they sang at the Mountain View SDA Church and again for the Summer Concert Series at Mt. Hermon CCC. Soon after this tour, they went on another Northern California tour where they sang in Lodi, Grass Valley, and at the ASI (Adventist-Laymen's Services & Industries) Convention in Sacramento. Back in Los Angeles, they were invited to sing for a Friday evening service at the Lake Avenue Congregational Church in Pasadena and prepared for another Men's Chorus Festival to be held in Sacramento. This tour took them to Roseville, the Lodi Zion Reform Church, and to the Carmichael SDA Church where the festival was held with groups gathering from the Bay Area, Bakersfield, Sonora, Modesto, and Carmichael. The year concluded with the honor of singing for the North American Division of SDA's Christmas Special, All Is Bright, filmed at the Adventist Media Center in Simi Valley, CA.

2006 found Christian Edition on another Arizona tour, this time to Yuma, where they sang at the Yuma Central SDA Church as well as at the Faith Lutheran and Grace Bible Fellowship Churches. CE was also invited to sing at the Glendale City SDA Church in Glendale, CA, and went on another Arizona tour, this time to the Phoenix area where they sang in Tucson, Paradise Valley, Glendale, and Sun City, again at the Stardust Bible Church. Back in Los Angeles, they gave concerts at the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart Convent, Messiah Lutheran Church in Yorba Linda, and at the Palm Desert and Azure Hills SDA Churches.

About this time, one of the bass singers, Sonny Ines, who was a graphic design artist and had designed all of CE's albums and promotional products, passed away of complications from open-heart surgery, and CE was asked to sing for his memorial service at the Eagle Rock SDA Church. 2006 was also CE's 25th Anniversary year which was celebrated in April with a concert at the Loma Linda University SDA Church. They were again invited to sing for the Glendale Adventist Academy Homecoming Vespers, this time at the Vallejo Drive SDA Church in Glendale, CA.

Two tours to Central California had CE singing in Porterville, Visalia, Modesto, and Turlock at Covenant Village and a month later at Peninsula Covenant Church in Redwood City, Sunnyvale SDA Church and again at Mt. Hermon CCC. In July, the guys were at Martinsound Studios in Alhambra, CA, recording their



eleventh album, a Christmas album titled Jesus, the Light of the World. This time, it was released in CD format only. The cover photo for this album was taken at Mt. Hermon CCC in the middle of summer in a heatwave in a room

with out A/C. But, if you look at the picture, you will see that almost everyone was dressed for winter in sweaters, scarves, and jackets. They were very glad when the photo session was finished and they could get out of their winter clothes!

In September, Christian Edition gathered at the Loma Linda University SDA Church to record another video with the Family Reunion musicians and a few weeks later, CE joined the *Voice of Prophecy* and the Family Reunion musicians on an Alaska cruise that took them from Seattle to Glacier Bay, Juneau, Sitka, Ketchikan, Victoria, BC, and back to Seattle. It was an amazing tour, and, in addition to all the sites to be seen, the cruise was full of music performed on board by the Family Reunion singers, and messages by Lonnie Melashenko were enjoyed by everyone who signed up to join the VOP Family Reunion Cruise.

In 2007, CE was again on a tour to the Yuma, AZ, area where they sang at the Yuma SDA Church as well as at Grace Bible Fellowship and the Gloria de Cristo Lutheran Church. Then they were off to San Diego where they sang in Bonita Valley, Paradise Valley, and Escondido at the First Congregational Church. In April they went on another Central California tour where they sang in the Clovis SDA Church, the Evangelical Free Church in Merced, and the First Church of the Nazarene in Fresno.

In May they again sang at the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart Convent in Los Angeles, at their "home" church, Eagle Rock SDA, and the West Covina Hills SDA Church. Later that year, Christian Edition was invited to sing for the Pacific Union Ministerial Convention at the Ontario Convention Center in Ontario, CA, and in September was thrilled and privileged to join gospel singer Sandi Patty in a concert at the La Sierra University SDA Church in Riverside, CA, where they sang "Opening Praise Medley" and "How Great Thou Art" with Sandi.





2009 started out with another Arizona bus tour with stops at the Organ Stop Pizza Parlor in Mesa, and concerts at Mesa Palms, Glendale, Prescott, and Trinity Bible Church in Sun City. A Midwest tour was built around the 3ABN Studios in Frankfort, IL, where CE recorded a



number of songs for a new video, God Wants to Hear You Sing, which was released the next year in DVD format only. On this trip, CE also sang at a number of churches in Michigan and Illinois, including the South Shore United Methodist Church in Chicago. CE was

privileged to visit the Nathan Greene Studio in Berrien Springs, MI, where they met the artist and had a wonderful time learning about some of his most well-known paintings. He was in the middle of creating a new masterpiece which he was kind enough to explain in detail the various elements in the painting.

In May, Christian Edition was again invited to sing at the *Voice of Prophecy* Vision Builders weekend program at the Renaissance Esmeralda Resort in Indian Wells, CA, this time with the Family Reunion musicians. CE also went on a tour to Utah where they sang in the Ogden, Salt Lake City, West Jordan, and Provo SDA Churches and at the American Fork Presbyterian

The tour included stops at the Fletcher, Asheville, Foster, and Greeneville, TN, SDA Churches, and at the Beverly Hills Baptist Church in Asheville.

On returning to California, CE went on another tour to Northern California where they sang at the Lodi Fairmont, Elmshaven, and Antioch SDA Churches, and the Martinez First Congregational Church.

In 2010, CE went on another tour to Yuma, AZ, where they sang at the Yuma SDA Church, the First United Methodist Church, and the Gloria de Cristo Lutheran Church.
