SIXTY HOURS: a Bus Trip to Arizona

FRIDAY—June 14, 2013, 7:30 A.M.

It begins in Glendale, California, where eleven sleepy Christian Edition members climb aboard a sleek white bus. After a short prayer, we depart promptly at 8:00 A.M. Those who want to sleep sit up front, talkers in the middle, and we game players gather at the rear of the big bus. Fred Miller, Gayle Craig, and I love to play a game with Rook cards called “Golf.” We play for almost thirty minutes with Craig and Charlie Vendouris before we arrive in Covina.

We make a stop there to pick up some special guests of Gayle’s: her two granddaughters, Eleanor, age 5, and Annabelle, age 3. Then we are off to Fontana for another special stop to pick up first tenor Henry Murray. At 9:20 A.M. we arrive in Loma Linda where the rest of our singers board the bus along with several of their family members.

We are on our way to Arizona by 9:40 A.M. About a half hour later, those of us in the back of the bus hear a strange popping sound fol-

lowed by an even stranger smell, like burning rubber. We listen apprehensively as our bus struggles on. Finally the driver pulls off to the side of the road to investigate. After a few minutes he starts out again and informs us, “The bus has no power, so we will have to wait here in Beaumont while they bring us another bus from Long Beach.” So here we are at the Oak Valley Parkway exit, in the parking lot of a small shopping area. It will be at least an hour until the replacement arrives, but we are grateful that the breakdown didn’t happen in the heat of the barren desert.

Most of us opt for an early lunch since we have a lot of time on our hands. Several in the group decide to exercise before eating. By the time the new bus arrives three hours later, we are all ready to continue

Miracle at Sixty-Five

Calvin had just turned sixty-five when his primary physician told him that Medicare would authorize a one-time-only complete physical upon joining Medicare. The doctor proceeded to do a complete workup and during the EKG examination, he noticed some slight abnormalities that he

wanted a cardiologist to check. Following a stress test, the cardiologist said Calvin needed an angiogram. In reviewing the results of the angiogram with Calvin and me, we learned that Calvin had 80–85% blockage in four of the cardiac vessels and that he would need immediate cardiac bypass surgery.

Upon hearing this news, Calvin flashed back to his best friend, Sonny Ines, who was also a diabetic,

and had this same surgery from which he never recovered. Calvin instantly had a terrible feeling that he would never see his family and friends again.

Calvin had a pre-surgery meeting with the cardiac surgeon who was going to perform the operation. In talking with him, Calvin expressed his worries (diabetic, overweight, etc.) about the surgery

and how he had lost his best friend to the same procedure. It was here that I believe God's leading became very evident to Calvin and me. The doctor told us that he was a Christian and that he was not in this profession to become rich or famous: "You need to know that I am really good." We both knew that God had led us to the right person.

The day before the surgery, Calvin and I were driving to the hospital for some scheduled tests when suddenly a pickup truck pulled up beside us on the road. We were surprised to see our son, Erich, but were even more shocked to see our daughter, DeAnne. She and Erich had planned this as a surprise for

her to fly in from Southern California so the whole family could be together. Another surprise was in store when Calvin's sister, Llona, flew in to be with us. My brother, Ken Williams, also stopped by to offer his support.

In addition to all the family support, the prayers of thousands of people from around the world were lifted up for Calvin, his doctor, and the family. I cannot thank the Christian Edition family and Carole Derry-Bretsch enough for getting the word out for people to remember us as we faced this crisis.

Gratefully, the surgery went without a hitch and the doctor said he was very pleased with everything. Calvin had to spend eight days in

the hospital after the surgery and was very surprised at how much energy it took just to get up, let alone walk just a short distance.

His favorite object became the stuffed pillow in the shape of a bear that he was told to hold tightly to his chest when he had to cough. Wow! It never left his sight. There were a few times when the coughing got so bad that he actually passed out. One of those times was when our pastor, George Gainer, was visiting. What a scare that gave him!

While in the hospital several pastors and friends stopped by to visit. An unexpected surprise was the visit of Calvin's long-time friend, Elder Larry Caviness, the Southern California Conference President.

After eight days Calvin was finally allowed to go home. He had learned that it was no vacation to spend time in a hospital. It was a real blessing to get home, sleep in his own bed, and not be awakened around the clock. His strength improved week by week, and because of his hospital stay, his eating habits changed drastically. In the seven weeks since the surgery he

has lost over forty pounds and he is determined to lose another twenty to thirty pounds by the New Year.

Calvin took his first post-surgery flight to Los Angeles on September 6 for the first Christian Edition rehearsal of the new season. Calvin said it was a GREAT reunion and the love he received from the CE family brought many tears to his eyes. He is grateful to be a part of Christian

Edition's 33rd year of ministry.

We both know that it wasn't just the expertise of the doctor that made Calvin's recovery successful; it was also the many, many prayers of loving people and, especially, the love of the Great Physician, Jesus Christ, who has given Calvin this miracle at sixty-five, a second chance at life and a continuing music ministry. ●

our trip to Arizona. From the new bus our director, Calvin, calls ahead and informs our host, Phil Draper, that we will probably miss our first singing appointment that evening at the camp meeting. Phil graciously assures Calvin that Christian Edition will be welcome whenever we arrive at Camp Yavapines in the mountains near Prescott, Arizona.

TWELVE HOURS—7:30 P.M.

As we arrive at the campground we are informed that we are next on the program. Arriving so late, we have neither checked into our hotel nor had time to change clothes, so the decision is made to sing “as is” in our travel wear. As we wait to go on, we watch in amazement as Arizona Conference President Tony Anobile auctions off some beautiful homemade quilts to raise funds for evangelism in the Arizona Conference. With bids in the \$1,000 range, we estimate that over \$10,000 is raised for evangelism in these few minutes. Our two songs are followed by the weekend’s featured speaker, Dr. Randy Roberts, Senior Pastor of the Loma Linda University Church in California. He will speak three different times during the two days we are there and we will be privileged to sing before each of his presentations. All of his messages are from Luke 15. After his inspiring “Lost Sheep” message, we find our way to our bus, ready to get to our hotel.

TWENTY-SIX HOURS—Saturday—9:30 A.M. We board the bus for the twenty-minute ride back to Camp Yavapines. There we are directed up the hill to a small building where we can gather for our morning devotional and rehearsal time. We move to the main auditor-

rium for the eleven o'clock service and sing three songs before Dr. Roberts speaks again from Luke 15. This time his subject is “The Lost Coin.”

After the service we are treated to lunch followed by a relaxing time visiting with friends and family members until our next appointment. At 4:00 P.M. we present another hour of worship and praise in song to a most appreciative congregation. After supper we proceed to our final meeting at 7:00 P.M. Dr. Roberts speaks again, movingly, from Luke 15, “The Lost Son.” At 9:45 P.M. the bus is waiting to take us back to our hotel and some much-needed rest for the following day’s schedule of more travel and singing.

FORTY-EIGHT HOURS—Sunday, 7:30 A.M. We board the bus and head out to our next stop, Trinity Bible Church, in Sun City. As we ride along, I notice that our direc-

tor, Calvin, looks troubled. When he informs us that a member of his family has been hospitalized in serious condition we quietly gather around to offer a special prayer for healing of his family member and for Calvin as he directs the music this morning with a heavy heart.

9:00 A.M. We arrive at our Sun City destination, greeted with a big blue sign saying, “Christian Edition—Performing June 16, 2013.” “Wow!” I say to myself. “They really love us here.” Always greeting us with his delightful comments, the pastor has a great sense of humor. During our call to worship, “Bow the Knee,” we notice that Calvin has tears in his eyes. At the end he thanks us because that is the song he needed to hear. In his final appeal he assures both us and the congregation that Satan will not take away his joy.

By 1:00 P.M. we are back on the road, heading for home. Most of us sleep much of the way and 5½ hours later we pull into Loma Linda. There are hugs and good-byes to the people who are leaving us here. The last call is, “See you in two weeks at Mt. Hermon.”


FIFTY-NINE HOURS—6:30 P.M. We are headed for Glendale, California, and the last ten CE members of the group remain: Fred, Lori, Michael, John, Ken, Rob, Paul, Malisa, Richard and myself. Our faithful bus driver is Bradford C. McDaniel. He hasn’t had much to say since our breakdown in Beaumont. He has just quietly done his job—well. We continue to be blessed by his business card which includes the following: “If you meet me and forget me, you’ve lost nothing. But if you meet Jesus and forget Him, you’ve lost everything.”

SIXTY HOURS—7:30 P.M. Our bus arrives in Glendale where we come full circle to where we began this wonderful weekend. We can reflect on several things: First, we have been blessed through all our years of travel never to have had a bus breakdown, until now. Second, we have never sung to a large audience in casual clothes. (Sorry Craig Vendouris, you missed this one!) Third, Trinity Bible Church greeted us in a very special way. Their love and appreciation were deep and timely. As we returned to our homes, we could look back on God's protection of our activities. I love this group of men with whom I sing. We are blessed!

And so ends our SIXTY HOURS. ●

eral of the selections. The album's title, *Simple Hope*, reflects Michael's faith journey since *Simple Prayers*.

"It's similar to when we do offering during a service," says Michael.

"The guys just sort of sneak in and then take off with the words for a big finish. We've done single songs like this on previous Christian Edition albums, and I've really enjoyed taking this concept to the broader canvas of a full length album."

Featuring music from styles ranging from African chant to gentle ragtime, to laid back jazz, and to country, this is an eclectic mix of new clothes for familiar tunes. "Mansion Over the Hilltop" is presented in the country style of Floyd Cramer, "Be Thou My Vision" in the contemporary jazz style of Dave Grusin, and "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder" in the style of *The Lion King*. Several Advent pioneer hymns worked together into the "Gather at the River Rag," which also features "Lift Up the Trumpet" and "In the Sweet by and By." "Near to the Heart of God" is paired with Ralph Carmichael's classic "A Quiet Place" to yield "A

Quiet Place of Rest." The instruments of "In My Heart There Rings A Melody" couldn't be bouncier, and standing stark in the stillness of solo piano is the classic anthem, "The Holy City."

Mixed in with these revamped familiar tunes are several less familiar songs, including "Mary's Song," written by Adventist composer Jeff Wood for a play of the same name thirty years ago in the Napa Valley. "A Simple Song" was written for the opening of The Kennedy Center by 20th century composer Leonard Bernstein. Jay Ungar's "Ashokan Farewell" is combined with Nick Glennie-Smith's "Mansions of the Lord" and "Hymn to the Fallen" by film composer John Williams to create an elegiac medley called "The Fallen Warrior." Simple guitar and piano begin "Gabriel's Oboe," and the men of Christian Edition are featured in "Welcome Home, Children." ●
